

INFORMATION REGARDING 2026-2027 FALL SEMESTER REGISTRATION

Dear students, the following rules are to be strictly observed for the course registration process.

If you have any questions about the registration process, or if you experience a problem during it, please FIRST contact your academic advisor. Please wait for the advisor's response before taking other steps. If you are to e-mail the department administration directly, your advisor must be CC'd to your e-mail.

- In ALL departmental elective courses, Section 1 is designated for fourth grade students, and Section 2 is designated for third grade students. Sufficient capacity will be available for both sections. If necessary, quota transfer may be made between sections. **Please be patient and keep checking the quotas, as courses that look full might later have some free spaces. In this regard, no requests for capacity increase should be made to the instructors or the department administration, creating extra e-mail traffic.**
- Courses from departments like psychology, sociology, history or philosophy that start with code 100 **cannot be taken as free electives.**
- Following the decision taken at the meeting of our department board dated 11 November 2024, effective from the 2024/2025 Spring semester, **the courses with the code 7950XXX taken from the Technical Vocational School (TKPR) will NOT be counted under the free elective course status in our department's programme.** Students who add one of these courses during registration process and get the advisor's approval by mistake **MUST** drop these courses during the add-drop week at the latest. This decision will not affect the course counting process of our students who have taken and successfully passed any of these courses, including the 2024/2025 Fall semester.
- **ENG211 MUST be taken in the first semester of the second year.** Postponing the course to later semesters makes graduation difficult. If you encounter difficulties in adding the course, please keep in mind that the Department of Modern Languages provides extra capacity later. It is very important to follow the announcements on their website: mld.metu.edu.tr
- Students can register to any section of the ENG101 and ENG211 courses. **Early registration is strongly advised as ENG101 capacities fill up quickly. Department of Modern Languages can update the capacity and criteria. Follow the announcement on their website during the registration period.**
- **HIST 2201 - Section 1 - Course Code 2402201**
The Department of History announced that if your courses overlap with this one, you should not drop any of them.

- Students who did NOT enter the Turkish central university examination (YKS) can take an additional departmental elective instead of ADM 3429, since the course is completely in Turkish. Students who have taken the YKS exam are required to take ADM 3429.
- Fourth grade students can take ONE graduate course upon the approval of the instructor. If you are interested in one of the courses listed, please contact the course instructor first. Keep in mind that two courses cannot be taken from the same faculty member in the same semester.
- Starting from the first day of registration after 14:00, some of the IR elective courses will be open for registration of students from our department. These courses can only be taken as "Free Elective". Please check the course criteria regularly.
- Student lists for the sections of most courses are determined by the department administration in advance, and section changes are not allowed except for certain cases of schedule conflict.
- Second grade students who will retake ADM 1121, ADM 1323 or ADM 2401 need to enroll in the appropriate sections of ADM 2121 and IR 206, WITH FIRST THE APPROVAL OF THEIR ADVISORS, in order to avoid clashes in their schedules.
- Second grade students who are to take courses from the first grade are advised to read the announcement for the first year students.
- Students are required to discuss any questions and problems related to registration with THEIR ADVISORS FIRST.
